RIGHTEOUSLY ENDURING TRIALS

- Some of our trials come from the actions of the wicked. Eventually the wicked will receive God's justice (121:1–25).
- Those who righteously endure trials will receive knowledge, experience, and the blessings of the priesthood and will be exalted (121:7–8, 26–33; all of 122).
- Power in the priesthood comes from righteous living. When a priesthood holder is worldly, proud, or desires to control others, he loses priesthood power (121:34–46).
- Often people who are placed in positions of authority exercise their power unrighteously (121:39–40).
- Because the Savior suffered more than any mortal could, He understands our suffering and feels compassion for us. Having faith in Him
